Interview summary:

Start 00:00 – KS was originally a full time teacher at Wallace High School who came to Stirling to do a part time Master's degree in Scottish Studies. It covered literature, social economics and history. There were at most six people in the Master's class.

03:43 – The learning in the Master's degree was found to be very different from KS's undergraduate degree. It was felt there was more discipline, less time available and a greater demand placed upon her class.

05:04 – KS found herself studying more especially on weekends. Was surprised to find that the Library did not open on a Sunday.

06:17 – Discusses how as a mature student it was felt that the Master's degree increased confidence in the skills that KS originally had and new ones that were gained from the course. It was also felt that the range of reading KS did was broadened through the degree.
